### 1. Summary

Sue goes to visit Mr. Behrman, their neighbour who is also an artist and tells him about Johnsy. The next morning, they wake up to a windy day, but the single leaf on the ivy is still there. Johnsy recovers. But Sue tells her that Mr. Behrman died in his sleep. He had fallen sick painting a leaf on the brick wall on a wet windy night, after the last leaf had fallen.

- Condition the state that someone or something is in
  We decided to get the table repaired as it was in a very poor condition.
- Interest the feeling of wanting to know or learn She looked around the museum with great interest.
- Respond to give an answer / reply
  At the interview, I was able to respond immediately because I was well prepared.
- Drawing-board a drawing board, usually made of wood on which artists or architects keep their paper and draw
  Asif was drawing a picture on the drawing-board of the vase of flowers in front of him.
- Whistled to make a sound by breathing air out through a small hole made by your lips She was so happy that she whistled a merry tune while cooking.
- Whisper to talk softly close to another person At movies and concerts we do not even whisper, because we do not want to disturb others.
- 12. Anxiously worried and nervousWe all waited anxiously for results of the examination.
- Creeper a plant that climbs the side of a structure, like a wall, giving out roots
  Ivy is a creeper that grows on the walls of old stone and brick houses.
- 14. Shedding droppingThe tree was shedding its leaves and was almost bare.
- 15. Finality being finished, so cannot be changed The finality of the umpire's decision made the batsman immediately leave the cricket field.
- Nonsense something silly or stupid She was talking nonsense and so we did not listen to her.



- 17. Confident being certain of your abilities, or having trust in people, plans, or the futureI am confident that we will win the match against Pakistan.
- Peacefully calmly, in a way that does not involve violence My mother was sleeping so peacefully that I did not have the heart to wake her up.
- Miner a person who works in a mine, where minerals and coal are dug out of the earth
  The coal miner's face and hands were black from the coal dust.
- **20. Model** something that can be copied because it is a very good example Our school is a **model** school and a lot of other schools are trying to follow our teaching methods.
- Masterpiece a work of art such as a painting, film or book that is made with great skill
  We went to the museum to admire the masterpieces by our famous artists.
- 22. Convinced certainI am convinced that I will be able to complete the work by the end of the day.
- **23. High temperature** fever during which the body heats up The child has a cold and cough and is also running a **high temperature**.
- **24. Complained** to say that something is wrong or not satisfactory I have **complained** to the Principal about your bad behaviour.
- 25. Tiptoed walked on toes with the heels of foot lifted off the ground so as to walk softlyWe all tiptoed into the room as the baby was sleeping in the cot there.
- 26. Peeped to secretly look at something for a short time, usually through a holeI peeped into the room to see whether the children were studying.
- 27. Feeble weak, not having enough strength After the illness I was so feeble that I could barely walk.
- 28. Nervous worried and anxious
  I was very nervous when the teacher said that the Principal would like to meet me.



- **29. Reluctantly** not willing to do something and therefore slow to do it Shobha **reluctantly** handed over her note book to the teacher.
- **30. Fierce** physically strong and frightening The lion gave a **fierce** growl and we all shivered with fright.
- **31.** Energetically to do things with vigour At the walkathon all the participants were walking **energetically**.
- Clinging staying close and attached The child was clinging to her mother in fright.
- 33. Cooperated to work or act together for a particular purpose; to be helpful by doing what someone asks you to do
  We all cooperated with our mother and did our share of the housework.
- Depressed unhappy and without hope
  She became very depressed when she learnt of the death of her favourite pet dog.
- **35. Gloomy** not expecting anything good in a situation The outlook for our economy is very **gloomy** at present.
- 36. Examining to look at or consider a thing or person carefully in order to find out something about them She was examining the painting carefully in order to find out if it was genuine.
- 37. Janitor North American term meaning caretaker of a building In the United States of America and Canada, the janitor provides cleaning and maintenance services to buildings like schools, offices and residential buildings.
- **38. Shivering** shaking slightly because of being cold, ill or frightened The whole family came into the warm house **shivering** with cold.
- **39.** Wondered asked yourself questions or wanted to know about something I have often wondered how she could clean the house in just one hour.
- Flutter to make movements up and down or from side to side or to cause something to do this The colourful flags were all fluttering in the breeze
