


The Bhils - A Presentation

In June, Rajni and Usha, along with technical support from Rajat, did an excellent presentation on the Bhil community for our mentors and mentees. Although the interesting and well-researched hour long presentation / inter-active



session covered the whole gamut of the Bhil community, including their dress, worship styles, festivals, etc., following are




some snippets from the presentation:

The name Bhil is derived from the word "Billu" which means bow. They are excellent archers with a deep knowledge of their local geography. Bhils are the oldest tribe in India. Some say Valmiki who wrote Ramayana was a Bhil. Others trace their ancestry to Eklavya from Mahabharata.

Bhils are the second largest tribe with a population of about 1.2 crores, and live mainly in Gujarat, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Chattisgarh, Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh. Bhils prefer to live in isolation in the hills and forests and don't really mix with the outside

world. They are a close knit community and are only allowed to marry within the clan.

Their literacy rate is extremely low; only 6.6 % in men and 1% in women. Traditionally, experts in guerrilla warfare, today most of them are farmers and agricultural labourers. They love to dance the Ghoomar and Gair and are skilled sculptors and artists. As we will see from the pictures, their art form (Pithora) is a language they use to express their life experiences. They



decorate the walls and ceilings of their mud huts with frescoes. The characters are all from real life. The Bhils use neem twigs, flour, turmeric, flowers, leaves and oil to create brilliant colours.

The presentation was followed by a short animated film "Hum Chitra Banate Hai" directed by Nina Sabnani. Before

concluding with a question and answer session, Rajni and Usha left the viewers with the following important message that came through from the film:

The story's message of water conservation was obvious. It also emphasized the importance of learning from nature. Birds, snakes and turtles are important characters that lead the villagers to water and show them ways to save it. The rooster grows from a timid and fearful bird into a community hero, offering his life for greater good. The real Shaman (a person regarded as having access to, and influence in, the world of good and evil spirits) silently shows the villagers how to take control of their own lives and environment.




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Mentor Round-Up


Thank You TTM!

Towards the middle of last year he got a job as a nursing orderly at Safdarjung Hospital. He loved the experience and was constantly observing the nurses at work. In his spare time he watched YouTube videos to update his nursing skills.

Unfortunately it was a temporary job and again he was in the job market. But the good that came out of this was that he had found his true calling. At around this juncture Mala happened to ask me about Asif. I told her about my dreams for him and she

suggested I speak to Neeru, who runs the Udyam Trust. I know Neeru well, but the thought hadn't occurred to me.

To cut a very long story short, she is mentoring him on his various paramedical choices. She is also educating me on paramedical fields and together Asif and I have drawn up a list of options and the pros and cons of



each. He hopes to register for a lab technician's course in March. The icing on the cake: Neeru and her group are hoping to finance the 2 year course!

I first met Asif at the Begumpur centre. He comes from an impoverished family and did not speak any English at all. What struck me about him was his earnestness, his



intelligence, his willingness to help everyone he came into contact with and also his determination to do something useful with his life. When Covid struck we stopped going to Begumpur and Asif was heartbroken. I decided to enrol him into TTM! and I've been mentoring him ever since.
